Subject: Protection of human rights in Europe

The European Community participated with full and equal rights in the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe (CSCE) and in the signing of the final act in Helsinki, and undertook a special responsibility for the protection of human rights in Europe.

Moreover, the signatory states have committed themselves to respect the dignity of man and his fundamental rights.

Are the Conference of Foreign Ministers and the Council prepared, therefore :

- to verify in which of the signatory states there have been infringements of human rights since the signing of the final act in Helsinki;
- in cases where such infringements have been identified, to raise them for discussion at the follow-up Conference in Belgrade and to demand that these infringements be discontinued?

In view of the political interest of the meeting, the chairman urges members to make every effort to attend the parliamentary committee meetings on 15 and 16 February or to volunteer to stand in for members who may be absent.
